Disabled Hockey is for individuals who are unable to play hockey with able-bodied teams due to having a disability such as:

- ★ Autism
- ★ Intellectual disability [including PTSD, traumatic brain injury]
- ★ Cerebral Palsy
- ★ Down Syndrome or another syndrome
- ★ Deafness or Hearing impairment
- ★ Reduced vision or blindness
- ★ Multiple Sclerosis
- ★ Muscular Dystrophy or other muscle-related disease
- ★ Spinal cord injury
- ★ Permanent (chronic) orthopedic or nerve injury
- ★ Spina Bifida
- ★ Amputation(s)
- ★ Other

Disciplines:

- **Special Hockey** – for individuals with intellectual disabilities; skating is in standing, individuals may have 1:1 assistance on and off the ice
- **Sled Hockey** – for individuals with physical disabilities that prevents them from skating in a standing position safely or at all. Equipment is provided for each participant
- **Standing /Amputee Hockey** – for persons with either an amputation and/or intellectual disability. Typically Veterans are involved in this discipline
- **Deaf/Hard of Hearing** – this discipline uses a variety of methods to communicate with it's players to teach how to play hockey. Eventually, the players integrate into abled-bodied teams who learn how to work with each player
- **Warrior Hockey** – for Veterans. They may play Special, Sled, Standing/Amputee or Deaf/Hard of Hearing hockey
